

Live webcam shows Temple Bar already rammed with St Patrick's Day revellers at 10am By Alex Dunne, March 17, 2025

Temple Bar was already rammed with St Patrick's Day revellers by 10am this morning.

A live stream by the website EarthCam showing the iconic Temple Bar pub has been documenting the area filling up with green clothes, novelty hats, Irish flags and shamrocks from early today. Both locals and tourists alike have been flocking to the area with the webcam showing hundreds of people there already by 10:20am.

More than half a million people are expected to line the streets of <u>Dublin</u> for today's <u>St Patrick's Day</u> parade which organisers claim will be one of the biggest ever. The parade of 4,000 participants will include marching bands from around the globe, performers in colourful costumes, troupes of dancers and a spectacular display of floats.

The theme is Eachtrai – the Irish word for adventures – which organisers say represents the "unique essence of Ireland and her people". The National St Patrick's Day Parade kicks off at noon.

It will run from Parnell Square, down O'Connell Street, over O'Connell Bridge and through the south side ending at the Cuffe Street/Kevin Street junction. It will be led by grand marshal Hollywood actress Victoria Smurfit, who described it as an "enormous honour".
